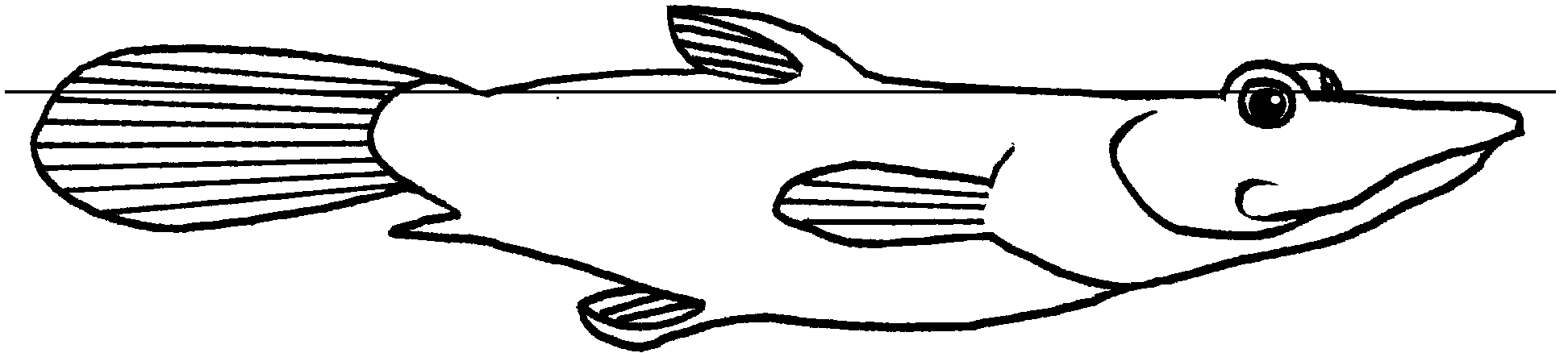


Anableps

The Anableps is the amazing two-eyed, four-retinaed fish. It swims just below the surface of water and can see below and above the water at the same time. It has a retina on the upper part of its eyes and another retina on the lower part of its eyes. Things above the surface of the water are focused on the lower retina, and things below the surface are focused on the upper retina.

The Anableps has no way to keep its eyes from drying out as it swims along the surface of the water, so it has to lower its eyes into the water often.

Scientists do not know the purpose for the unique vision of the Anableps. When we consider this remarkable fish, we are just amazed again at God's creative genius.
